**Subject: Request for strict criminal action against the accused persons involved in cheating 22 unemployed youths from Srikakulam District in the name of overseas jobs in Azerbaijan through fake visas, fake offer letters, and fake medical certificates.**

**Respected Sir/Madam,**

I, P. Ramesh Babu, State President of the World Human Rights Research Council (WHRRC), Andhra Pradesh, am submitting this complaint on behalf of the victims. A copy of the complaint submitted by the applicants along with supporting documents is enclosed herewith for your kind consideration.

As per the complaint received, a person named Makka Suresh (Mobile No. 77350 66071), belonging to Srikakulam District, in conspiracy with the management of PRISM Institute, Chandigarh (Mobile No. 8146725758), allegedly committed a large-scale fraud by falsely promising high-paying jobs in Azerbaijan to 22 innocent unemployed youths from Srikakulam District.

The accused persons collected huge amounts of money from the victims in the name of overseas employment. According to the statements of the victims, an amount of approximately Rs. 5,80,000/- was collected through online/PhonePe transactions and Rs. 1,14,000/- was collected in cash, totaling Rs. 6,94,000/- illegally obtained from the victims.

The victims stated that the accused persons took them from Visakhapatnam to Delhi and thereafter to Chandigarh, where they were accommodated in a rented lodging facility for about one week. During this period, the victims were taken daily to PRISM Institute to create a false impression that the overseas employment and visa processing procedures were genuine. The accused further claimed that medical examinations were mandatory for foreign employment and collected an additional Rs. 5,000/- from each victim for conducting a fake medical camp. Subsequently, fake offer letters, fake visas, and fake medical certificates were provided to the victims in order to deceive them.

When the victims realized that they had been cheated and questioned the accused persons, they were allegedly threatened and intimidated. The victims further stated that the management of PRISM Institute demanded Rs. 1,30,000/- from each person for sending them to Azerbaijan. It has also been alleged that when all 22 victims visited the institute, the management, along with certain local anti-social elements, confined them inside a room, created fear and panic among them, and demanded an additional payment of Rs. 35,000/- from each victim. Later, with the assistance of some local individuals, the victims managed to escape from the premises.

It has also been alleged that despite contacting the emergency service number 112 (Call Reference No. 803819), no effective assistance was provided. The victims further stated that although they continuously approached the concerned police station for the past three days, their complaint was not accepted. Additionally, serious allegations have been made against a Head Constable named "Pravesh," who allegedly behaved rudely with the victims and demanded Rs. 1,40,000/- in exchange for returning their passports.

Due to this fraud, all the victims are facing severe financial hardship and mental distress, as most of them had borrowed money in order to pay the accused persons. The matter appears to involve organized interstate fraud, document forgery, cheating, criminal intimidation, and exploitation of unemployed youths, which requires urgent and strict legal intervention.

Therefore, we humbly request you to kindly treat this matter with utmost seriousness and register strict criminal cases against Makka Suresh, the management of PRISM Institute, Chandigarh, and all other persons involved in assisting this fraud under the relevant provisions of the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita (BNS), Information Technology Act, Passport Act, and other applicable laws, and conduct a fair, impartial, and detailed investigation.

### **We further request that:**

1. The money collected from the victims be recovered and returned to them.
2. The passports of the victims currently in the possession of PRISM Institute be immediately returned through appropriate legal action.
3. A special investigation be conducted into fake overseas employment rackets and the entire interstate network behind this scam be exposed.
4. An inquiry be conducted into the conduct of Head Constable "Pravesh," and appropriate legal and departmental action be taken if found guilty.
5. Strict preventive measures be implemented to ensure that no other innocent unemployed youths fall victim to such fraudulent activities in the future.

**We sincerely hope that immediate and appropriate action will be taken to ensure justice for all the victims.**
